Irony

- An expression/situation where result is *opposite*, or *contradictory* to, what was intended/meant.
 - Signals difference between appearance and reality of things
- Three types:
 - Verbal irony: say one thing and mean another
 - "It sure is a nice day for a picnic," in the middle of a rainstorm
 - Situational irony: result is *opposite* of what was intended
 - You laugh at your friend for stepping in the mud, only to then step in a puddle yourself
 - Dramatic irony: we know what's going to happen but the character doesn't
 - We know that the wolf is in Grandma's clothes, but Little Red Riding Hood doesn't

Mistake-ing Irony

- It is very easy to mistake irony, and misidentify it
 - Alania Morissette's song <u>Ironic</u>
- Let's see...Ironic or not?
 - The name of Britain's biggest dog (until it died recently) was Tiny...
 - YES, ironic
 - A man is incarcerated in a prison he used to be the warden of...
 - YES, ironic
 - "It's like rain on your wedding day."
 - NO, not ironic.
 - It might be ironic if it's raining on your wedding day in the desert. Or snowing on a wedding day in July.
 - Drawing trees on paper...
 - This one could go either way,. Irony is somewhat subjective, so for something like this context matters

Always be careful to distinguish between sarcasm and irony. They are not always the same thing!
