Setting and Time - the American West

- Generally, 1860-1910 What historical events where going on in America at this time?
- Incorporates the Civil War into the film directly, or the background
- May extend further back to the colonial period, or forward to the mid 20th century
- May range geographically from Mexico to Canada
- Usually set against stunning American landscapes. **Examples:**
- In some movies the landscapes are more the stars than the actors
- Stress the harshness of the landscape, or juxtapose the beauty of it with the dirtiness of a town
