

- 1. Sources are referred to in a "Works Cited" list that should begin at the top of a separate page after the last page of essay text.
- 2. All entries in the works cited list should be double-spaced with no extra line spaces between entries.
- 3. The first line of each entry in the works cited list should be flush to the left margin, and each subsequent line for that entry should be indented one-half inch (i.e. hanging indent).
- 4. The works cited list should be arranged in alphabetical order, based on the first word of each entry. For most entries, this will be the last name of the author.
- 5. If the author of a work is unknown, alphabetize the entry by the title of the work.
