

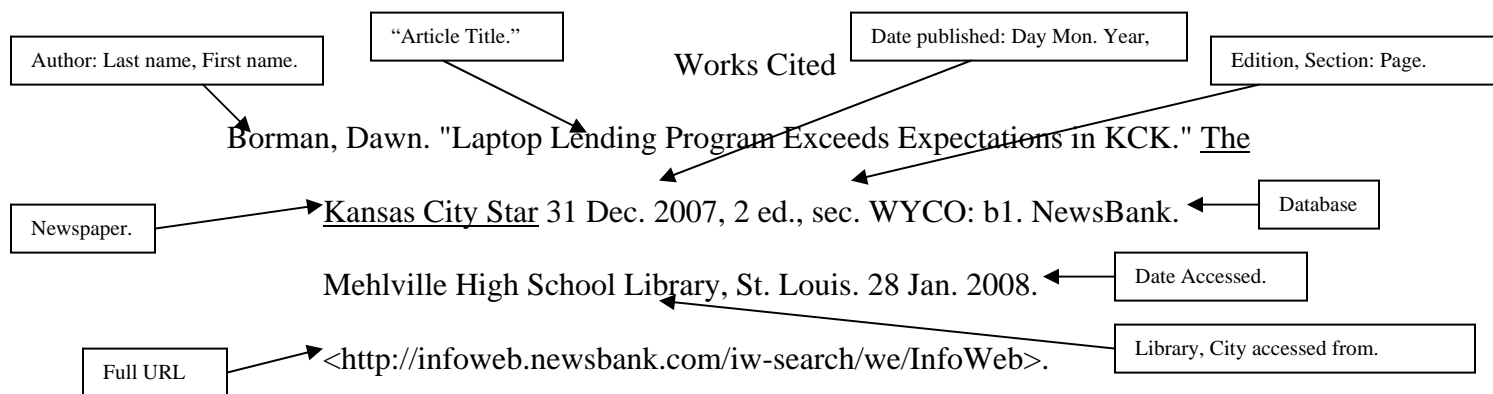

General Rules

1. Sources are referred to in a "Works Cited" list that should begin at the top of a separate page after the last page of essay text.
2. All entries in the works cited list should be double-spaced with no extra line spaces between entries.
3. The first line of each entry in the works cited list should be flush to the left margin, and each subsequent line for that entry should be indented one-half inch (i.e. hanging indent).
4. The works cited list should be arranged in alphabetical order, based on the first word of each entry. For most entries, this will be the last name of the author.
5. If the author of a work is unknown, alphabetize the entry by the title of the work.
