

Definition

A limerick is a verse of five lines, usually humorous. Lines one, two, and five rhyme, as do lines three and four (aabba). Some examples vary but the number of syllables usually follow this pattern:

Line 1	8 syllables	A (rhyme)
Line 2	8 syllables	A (rhyme)
Line 3	5 syllables	B (rhyme)
Line 4	5 syllables	B (rhyme)
Line 5	8 syllables	A (rhyme)

Example: Out dining, a young alligator, When asked if he'd have coffee later, Just shook his large head And pleasantly said, "I was planning on having the waiter."
